Motion to Approve last General Meeting Minutes

Special General Meeting, November 5, 2024

Preliminary Matters

David Gluzman called the meeting to order at 7:00pm and took the chair. Marieke De Jonge appointed Aimee King to act as Secretary of the meeting. Aimee King noted purpose of meeting was to consider amalgamation of the Society with the West Kelowna Trail Crew Society. Appointment of Secretary/ScrutineerChair confirmed that the board of directors of the Society arranged for Marieke De Jonge and Aimee King to act as joint Secretaries and Scrutineers of the meeting. Notice of Meeting Chair confirmed that notice of the meeting was forwarded to the members of the Society in accordance with the Societies Act and the Society's by-laws. Notice contained the resolutions regarding the amalgamation. Quorum Secretaries and Scrutineers confirmed that there was quorum present, being 81 of the 789 members of the Society. The number of members required was 24 (being 3% of the Society's members) and as such the meeting was properly constituted for the transaction of business.

Commencement

Chair called and constituted meeting for transaction of business.

Explanation of Voting Procedures

Chair explained the voting procedures and the number of votes required for a passing resolution, that number being 62.

Amalgamation

RESOLVED THAT the amalgamation as between the Society and West Kelowna Trail Crew Society is approved, and that the Society will enter into, adopt, and carry out the terms of the Amalgamation Agreement as circulated. Ryan McKenna motioned that the special resolution regarding the amalgamation with West Kelowna Trail Crew Society be approved. Cam Lainchbury seconded the motion. No discussion from members took place. By a show of hands the vote was passed.





Membership YoY





Where are you riding the most?



How are the trail conditions?




